

Generosity in action

One of the resources I use for my daily quiet time is an app called **You Version**. Each day, there is a scripture passage, a short video, and other resources that encourage reflection on the verse(s) of the day. This one challenged me. I share it with you to see how God uses it to challenge you.

What Does It Mean to Be Generous?

The word "generous" is often defined as: open in giving or sharing; willing to give help or support; unselfish. Generous living is not a concept limited to the wealthy, the gifted, or the lucky. Generosity is a lifestyle that stems from a desire to worship God in every area of life.

The principle of generosity is laced all throughout Scripture, and we have the best model and mentor when it comes to seeing it in action — God. He sent His Son, Jesus, as a sacrifice for our mistakes so that way we could spend eternity with Him. That is generosity in action.

Psalm 24:1 says that "the earth is the LORD's and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it…" Everything we have belongs to God and is given to us by Him. He is the owner, and we are His managers. And the people who manage well are often entrusted with more to manage. It doesn't matter how much we have; it matters what we do with what we're given.

We will live generously when we view everything we have as a gift from God. And when we do that, our mindsets switch from "This is mine?" to "How can I share?" So, right now, think about how you view the things God has given you. Do you see them as gifts from God to be shared, or as accomplishments and possessions you've earned? What is one thing you can start doing today to become more generous?

The Message of Jesus

How many times on a Sunday morning do we hear the name, Jesus? I have never counted how many times the name of Jesus is repeated from my sermon. As a preacher-pastor, when I use the name of Jesus, I make many assumptions that we all believe about Jesus.

In *The Beginning of Christianity*, author Clarence Craig has a chapter titled: "The Kingdom of God and The Sign of its Coming." In this chapter, he seeks to identify Jesus of Nazareth and the central message of Jesus. Jesus believed the LORD God reigned over the nations of the world. In other words God was King. Jesus also believed God's will was made known in the Hebrew Scriptures, our Old Testament. As Christians, we believe Jesus is the Christ or Messiah, the anointed personal messenger of God. The LORD God was incarnated in Jesus. Jesus reveals the true nature of God. The second paragraph of the Apostles' Creed outlines the basic belief of the Church.

In the Gospel of Mark, readers find Jesus introduced as one who took up the ministry of John the Baptist after his arrest. Jesus' message is summarized as "the time is fulfilled, and the Kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news (Mark 1:15)." What does Jesus mean by the Kingdom of God? In Matthew's Gospel: the Kingdom of Heaven is used instead of the Kingdom of God because the name of God is so respected that it cannot be said aloud.

There is no doubt in the faith of Jesus that God is over all the world. God is king and reigns as sovereign LORD. Jesus as a Jewish person was raised and taught by his father and mother in the ways of the Torah or Law and in the local synagogue. God as king had created the world. God was to be respected and worshipped as the giver of life. The person who wishes to be righteous takes the yoke of the Law to obey. Jesus uses this metaphor as a symbol of obeying the teaching of Jesus. "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me... for my yoke is easy and burden is light (Matthew 11:29-30)."

Jesus is an apocalyptic thinker influenced by the contemporary thought of his day that the day of the LORD was near. The prophets through the history of Israel had predicted a day of judgment for the world. This day was close in the minds of devout Jews and Jesus and even in the works of Paul. The judgment of God is changed from condemnation to salvation as the individual repents and trusts in the promises of the Kingdom of God.

Very early in my thinking, study and living in the church, I realized the Church was not the Kingdom of God. Jesus' concept as conveyed in the Gospels was much greater than what existed on earth. God was creator and members of the Kingdom agree to follow God's law revealed in the Scripture. The inclusion of a person in the Kingdom creates a striving or seeking for more of the benefits of the Kingdom. The Kingdom of God is received as a gift. It is the great pearl worth everything of value in a person's life. The Kingdom of God is so important that it must be sought after as the most important aspect of life: "Seek first the Kingdom of Heaven and God's righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well (Matthew 6:33)."

Dedicated volunteers rehabilitate home for Florence family

On May 11, Helping Florence Flourish held a celebration and house dedication for a family that it has worked with since 2022. Volunteers with the nonprofit started renovating the uninhabitable property located at 415 N. McQueen St. in September 2022. House of Hope, a nonprofit with a mission to provide safe haven for the homeless in Florence, gave the property to a Florence woman with three children. The project, "The Queen of McQueen," was spearheaded by First Presbyterian's Charlie Caldwell with significant help from over 40 different volunteers. The South Florence High School track team, a mission team from Kings Academy, the HVAC class from Florence-Darlington Technical College, along with many covenant partners from First Presbyterian helped make this possible, said Rev. Chris Handley, executive director of HFF.
