# Investments as Ministry

For most of us, the words invest, investing or investments are associated with money and financial matters. The primary definition of invest is: "to expend money with the expectation of achieving a profit or material result by putting it into financial plans, shares, or property, or by using it to develop a commercial venture." So, it is no wonder that when we hear the word invest, our thoughts immediately go to things such as the stock market, financial advisors, 401(k) and retirement accounts. The word invest has a secondary definition that is: "to provide or endow someone or something with (a particular quality or attribute). I want to look at this definition as it pertains to the ministry of First Presbyterian Church

Sunday, May 5, will be Confirmation Sunday. On that day, we will recognize and welcome 20 Confirmands as covenant partners in our church. Since last August this group of sixth-graders has been involved in the confirmation process of our church, which includes catechism class and a 13-week mentoring process, where the confirmands are paired with an adult covenant partner (mentor). The mentor is not someone who has all the answers but rather someone who is willing to share his/her journey of faith with another person who is an apprentice in the faith. Through this process, the catechism leaders and mentors have invested in the lives of these young people. I have had the privilege to be a mentor to three different confirmands over the past few years. Many of you have mentored confirmands through the years understand that the return on investment is watching a young person grow and mature in their faith and understanding of God. The catechism leaders and mentors are only a few of the people who have invested in the lives of the confirmands. When a child is baptized into our congregation, the covenant partners are asked if they will nurture and support the child as they grow in faith. Nursery workers, Sunday School teachers, VBS leaders, Wednesday night study leaders and others have invested in the lives of these young people along the way. First Presbyterian Church is blessed with covenant partners who understand and are involved in the secondary definition of investing both in our church and in the community. Through leading a small group,

teaching a Sunday School class, GriefShare ministry or involvement in one of the many benevolence agencies we support, our covenant partners are investing in the lives of people. The return on these investments will not show up on a quarterly earnings statement in an investment portfolio. It will be found in changed lives. There is a tendency to think of stewardship strictly in terms of money. When it comes to Christian stewardship, however, it is far more than money — it's your life! Aspects of Christian stewardship is life lived in Christ, the life of discipleship. It takes seriously the psalmist's affirmation that "the earth is the Lord's and all that is in it" (Ps. 24:1).

Faithful stewards are always growing. They never graduate from the school of discipleship. Christ calls his disciples to be always on the cutting edge of life. As we are nurtured in our faith, we grow in our understanding of what it means to have "the mind of Christ." As our senses and sensibilities are stimulated by the Holy Spirit, we grow as stewards and mature as obedient disciples. We truly have far more resources given to us by God than we even realize. So, in what ways are you stewarding the resources (time, talent, and treasure) given to you?


# The Resurrection in Luke

The Resurrection of Jesus in the Gospel of LUKE consists of three appearances. Jesus appears to the women on Resurrection morning in LUKE 24:1-12. The travelers on the road to Emmaus entertain Jesus, not knowing that he was the Resurrected Jesus in LUKE 24:13-35. Their reaction is "Were not our hearts burning within us (LUKE 24:32)." The third appearance of Jesus is to the disciples as the travelers relate to them how the Resurrected Jesus comes to them. There are two surprising actions of the disciples in these occurrences. The emotional reaction of the disciples to the Resurrection is surprising. Fear is identified in the women and the disciples. A second reaction of the disciples is the joy of the gift of having their minds opened to the Scriptures.

The reaction of the disciples to the Risen Jesus is: "And while they still disbelieved for joy, and wondered (LUKE 24:41)." This seems to be a strange combination of emotions for one to have. Disbelief, joy, and wonderment are all included at the same moment. The Resurrection of Jesus always produces that kind of response. At a death we are in grief, but as Christians our doubt and disbelief is balanced by our hope. Joy is the emotion that we all strive for. Joy is more than a feeling. Joy is an attitude that overcomes our grief and depression.

The second surprising statement is the gift Jesus brings to his disciples. "Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures (LUKE 24:45)." The gift of God to any of us to open our minds and help us understand the scriptures seeing God's plan in Christ. The disciples are full of mixed and confused emotions until their minds are opened by God's Spirit in Christ and then they understand. This is the gift of faith Jesus gives to his disciples and then sends them into the world to proclaim Jesus as the Messiah as outlined in the Hebrew Scriptures or the Protestant Old Testament.

I believe being open-minded means I will listen to new ideas and consider changing my opinion about a difficult issue. Letting Jesus open my mind is different than being open-minded. Jesus' words are not an opinion but are the truth. The correct meaning of Scripture opens our mind. When Jesus opens the Scripture he is giving them the correct interpretation of the Hebrew



Scriptures. We do not have the exact passages nor what Jesus told them. Much of our New Testament is explaining Old Testament fulfillment of things concerning Jesus as the Messiah. I believe reading Scripture gives me the ability to listen and be open-minded and opens my mind to the truth of God.

Jesus meets the disciples in the time between his resurrection and ascension opening the Old Testament to them to show he was the Messiah or Christ. The New Testament is the witness to the truth of Jesus. We as Christians believe these Gospels, letters, and sermons are Scripture. An opened mind does not mean we are open to ideas contrary to Scripture. The Church has for centuries sought to find the truth using the New Testament's witness to Jesus. There is no better way to find the truth than by studying the Old Testament and the revelation of God through Jesus in the New Testament.

#### Congregational meeting to be held

A congregational meeting will be held at 10:40 a.m. Sunday, May 19, in the sanctuary for the purpose of electing four Covenant Partners to serve on the Officer Nominating Committee (ONC). Members of the ONC will decide who might be the Lord's persons for the respective roles of deacon and elder. They then prayerfully ask these people to consider serving and bring that slate for the Congregation to affirm. Prior to nominating a Covenant Partner, please confirm his/her willingness to serve on the ONC. Please review ECO Polity regarding the roles of Deacons and Elders. Here are the roles for each as described in our Constitution:

2.02 Elders are given authority and responsibility, along with pastors, to oversee the spiritual health of the congregation as well as the congregation's faithfulness to God's mission. Elders may also be asked to preach and teach. Elders shall be elected by the congregation.

2.03 The Ministry of Deacons Ordinarily, the biblical office of deacon shall be utilized by the congregation. Deacons lead ministries that nurture fellowship and caregiving within and beyond the congregation. Deacons may also be asked to preach and teach. The congregation shall determine the manner in which they are selected for service. The session shall oversee and direct the ministry of the deacons.

# Children's Ministry Corner

Dear Church Family,

If I asked you, is Children's Ministry important? What would you say?

My answer is yes, absolutely, 100%, Children's Ministry is extremely important if not one of the most important! I say this because I am a firm believer in Proverbs 22:6, especially since I was a Proverbs 22:6 kid!

"Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old, he will not depart from it." (ESV)

"Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old, they will not turn from it." (NIV)

You see, there was a season in my life when I became a "know-it-all" teenager, which lasted through my mid-20s. It was a time when I decided I didn't need the church; I didn't need God. Peer pressure influenced my decisions; worldly things grabbed my attention. There were some dark times for me. Yet, during those times, God was there pulling on my heartstrings.

Over the past 20 plus years I have reflected over this time in my life. I believe with my whole heart the reason I could feel God's presence was because I was raised in the church. I know without a doubt, seeds were planted, and took root. I also know, as a child, I felt God's presence through the love that was poured into me from Sunday School teachers, youth advisors, my pastor, church members, the youth group and so many more. I saw, heard, and experienced how the love of Jesus looked, sounded, and behaved. Thankfully, the day came when I realized what I was seeking in the world, was actually what I had experienced as a child — a relationship with Jesus and His people. He was the only one who could fill the void and emptiness in my life.

The more I see, the more I know children need to "taste and see that the Lord is good" Psalm 34:8. They need to be trained up in the way they should go, so when they become a "know-it-all," seeds have been planted, the love and presence of God has been felt, and when they are old they will not depart from it.

I know from experience the importance of Children's Ministry. If it weren't for the Children's Ministry I was a part of growing up, I am not sure where I would be today. It certainly made a difference in my life, and I hope and pray we are making a difference in the lives of the children who walk through the doors at FPC.


Dear Church Family,
